

# CDC BUTEO

## HARD RED WINTER WHEAT



CDC Buteo is a high yielding, winter hardy, medium height semi-dwarf, hard red winter wheat. CDC Buteo is a medium maturity and has excellent winter hardiness resulting in outstanding spring recovery and ground cover. CDC Buteo provides excellent potential under dryland production systems. This variety is too tall for irrigated production. CDC Buteo is a stay-green variety with good stem rust resistance, is moderately susceptible to leaf rust and an MS-S reaction to Fusarium head blight.

### MANAGEMENT STRATEGY

#### Minnesota / North Dakota / South Dakota

1. Plant Certified seed 1-2 inches below the soil surface.
2. Plant at a rate of 950,000 – 1,250,000 live plants per acre.
3. To maximize economic yields, apply adequate levels of nutrients based on soil fertility and yield goal recommendations. An 80 bushel yield target is a good starting point for CDC Buteo. In general, 2.5 pounds of Nitrogen per bushel of expected yield should be applied.
4. CDC Buteo is MS-S to Fusarium head blight (scab). Where scab is a problem, CDC Buteo should be treated with fungicide at the 4-5 leaf stage and at flowering.
